


2018 SESSION HIGHLIGHTS



MAJOR MULTI-YEAR INFUSION OF LOCAL ROAD FUNDING

- Under new 5-year plan, State funding for local roads will nearly double for FY 2020-2024
- Legislators and local governments collaborated on the biggest step forward since the deep cuts of 2009

MAJOR COUNTY INITIATIVES MOVING FORWARD

- Important advances in school construction smarter process, and stronger state funding
- Next-Generation 9-1-1 Commission passed, to bring all jurisdictions into next-level service
- Helpful correction to Public Information Act laws protects citizen contact information from unfair distribution to outside companies, etc.

PROTECTED LOCAL BUDGETS AND REVENUES

- The state budget passed this year: no new county cutbacks, cost shifts, or unfair new burdens
- Major proposed cost shift of assessment office was rejected after aggressive county urging

DEFENDED LOCAL DECISION-MAKING

- "Small Cell Wireless" remains a local matter fended off broad statewide pre-emption
- Defeated broad and costly employer mandates on all local government employers, and comparable bill on community colleges
- Resisted overstepping into local pensions
- Intrusive bills on land use planning, local licensing, security systems all resolved
